

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MESSAGE FROM COUNTRY DIRECTOR

In 2023, Save the Children International China Country Office (SC China CO) concentrated its efforts on designing and implementing programmes that would have a tangible impact on children by working closely with local partners and communities to identify and address their needs. We have signed a memorandum of cooperation with the China Global Philanthropy Institute of Beijing Normal University to jointly plan and implement programmes to promote children's development, focusing on the work areas and issues identified in the Law of the People's Republic of China (PRC) on the Protection of Minors, the Law of the PRC on the Promotion of Family Education, the Middle- and Long-term Youth Development Plan (2016-2025), and the China National Program for Child Development (2021-2030), particularly in relation to rural left-behind children, urban migrant children, adolescents, and children with disabilities. With the support of the Supreme People's Procuratorate of the PRC and a research team from the China University of Political Science and Law, we conducted and completed a study on the subject of child-friendly judicial standards in which

indicators also were drafted. The research on the standards made up for the gaps and deficiencies in the existing research on child-friendly justice in China, and became an important reference for guiding the judicial practice for minors. With the support of the expert group, we organised several seminars on school safety management and education. We also participated in the editing of the book *Comprehensive School Safety: Theory and Practice of Safety Management in Primary and Secondary Schools*, which compiled a theoretical framework for school safety and supported the expert group in formulating policy recommendations on school safety management.

In addition, we responded to Save the Children's global climate change campaign Generation Hope, which reached 11 million views in China, setting a remarkable global record for Save the Children's social media audience. Our Youth Development Project and the Yunnan Rural Early Childhood Development Project were both awarded Charity Projects by the 13th Charity Festival, marking the third consecutive year that we have won awards at the Charity Festival and recognizing our programmes in China.

The year 2023 was full of opportunities and challenges. China introduced series of child-friendly related laws and regulations, and Barrier-free Environment Creation Law of the PRC came into effect on September 1, 2023, to guarantee that disabled groups can integrate into social life in an equal, full, and convenient manner. Furthermore, standards for child-friendly cities have been promoted at a rapid pace, with clear requirements for the planning, design, construction and child-friendly renovation of child-friendly

spaces from a child's perspective and with respect for children's physical and mental development. Several departments have strengthened the quality improvement of care services for rural left-behind children and children in difficult circumstances, as well as mental health care services for children in difficult circumstances. By the end of 2023, the Charity Law of the PRC completed its first amendment to improve the emergency charity system and regulate charitable activities, providing safeguards for the healthy development of the charity. In the year 2024, we will actively respond to changes in national policies and children's needs, such as child safety on the Internet, children's mental health issues, reducing the impact of climate change on children, and other emerging issues related to children, as well as promote the concerns of all parties on the issues through research and seminars, improve policies related to the issues, and lead the exploration of the practice of public welfare.

The security situation remains critical globally, due to frequent political conflicts and natural disasters. The Russia-Ukraine conflict, the Israeli-Palestinian conflict, the earthquake in Turkey, the floods in Pakistan, and the high temperature and drought in Africa have seriously affected children's rights and interests in survival - over 150 million children face food insecurity globally, more than 1 billion children live at extremely high climate risk, 1 in 6 children are affected by conflict, and record numbers of children are being forcibly displaced. Save the Children provided a proactive response to children's needs and found effective solutions, reaching 16 million people in 44 countries globally through emergency response in 2023; contributing to 47 policy, leg-

islative, budget, service/system changes, including at least 20 wins secured with children; supporting at least 5,000 children in 34 countries to engage in campaigning through Generation Hope campaign.

Finally, we would like to express our gratitude to our partners, donors, various industry organisations and the public for their continued trust and support to Save the Children! **We sincerely invite all of you to be our children's guardians and add colours to the blank paintings in our annual report. We hope that this annual report will be a gift for you to interact with the children and convey the concept of Child safeguarding while sharing the progress of China programmes.**





March 2023

European Union Ambassador to China Jorge Toledo led the delegation to visit SC China CO.



In recognition of our contributions to the draft and the revision of the National Standard for Specification for Minor's Justice Social Work Services, we were awarded a commemorative trophy and a letter of appreciation from the drafting team of the National Standard.

April 2023



August 2023

Hassan Noor Saadi, Director of Save the Children Asia Regional Office, visited our local partners, and our supervisory units in China which are the Ministry of Civil Affairs and the Beijing Municipal Public Security Bureau.

September 2023

The global best practice primer on "Parenting without Violence Bronze Course", developed with the China Global Philanthropy Institute of Beijing Normal University, was launched and disseminated to 51 civil society organisations (CSOs), schools, civil affairs units and other institutions.

November 2023



With the China Red Cross Foundation Baby Friendly Hospital Initiative Development Fund, we jointly organised a World Prematurity Day "Love and Future—Believe in the Power of Embracing" campaign, with 120 hospitals nationwide participating and over 140,000 people being reached both online and offline.

December 2023

We signed a memorandum of cooperation with the China Global Philanthropy Institute of Beijing Normal University to expand the scope of cooperation in the field of child protection and development.

Together with Shanghai United Foundation, we launched the World Children's Day "Make Friends with Your Emotions" campaign, focusing on children's mental health issues, with a total of 7,425,000 views on the online campaign, and 283 families benefiting directly from the campaign.


HEALTH AND NUTRITION PROGRAMME

We have provided scientific feeding and care services for newborns, including up-grading the breastfeeding and “kangaroo care” skills of health workers and family caregivers; supported the early development of children aged 0-3 years old through backing the regular operation of community-based early childhood development centres, and conducting activities and training to enhance the scientific parenting skills of family caregivers and child workers, so as to provide infants and toddlers with safe and supportive environments for growth in the family and the community. In addition, we have provided adolescent reproductive health services.








Adolescent Reproductive Health Care Needs and Services

We provided support to the Chinese Association for Maternal and Child Health Studies in the exploration of "Adolescent Reproductive Health Care Needs and Services" by organising an **expert seminar** on the Reproductive Health Basic Survey Plan and developing a research plan.



BENEFICIARY STORY

Healthy Growth Begins with Breastfeeding



Mei* comes from a family of tea farmers in Cangyuan County, Yunnan Province. She has a three-year-old daughter and a one-year-old son. Upon the birth of her daughter in 2020, Mei was fraught with doubts about breastfeeding, like whether her breast milk was enough and the choice of baby-feeding materials to complement breast milk. Having followed the elder generations' upbringing experience, she stopped breastfeeding her elder daughter at 1 year's age and never read a picture book to her — the value of these practices was yet to be noticed by this village near the border of Yunnan Province.

Mei's very first encounter with SC China CO's Health and Nutrition Programme was when she joined the breastfeeding advocacy and guidance activity held in communities, where she learned breastfeeding knowledge and scientific feeding skills. Mei was also amazed to discover changes in the mentality and practices of breastfeeding in their county-level hospital: at the birth of her son, doctors intro-

duced the benefits of breastfeeding to her family and informed the appropriate way to breastfeed. This time, Mei has exclusively breastfed her baby for the first six months and hopes to continue breastfeeding until he gets two years old.

Mei also learned new skills from the Programme's training, like interactive games with children to promote their brain development. Mei joined SC China CO as a community service worker in December 2021, to help more children and popularise the importance of breastfeeding and children's early development to more families. Twice a month, she organised parent-child group activities and made one-to-one home visits in her village. She read picture books to children and played interactive games with them -- these are effective ways to foster children's lingual, physical, cognitive, and socio-emotional development.

Mei said: "The most impressive thing I did was to help a 35-month-old child learn the ancient poem Min Nong. When I was a child, I only began to learn Chinese poems at around second grade in primary school, but nowadays children get to know it from such a young age, which is quite good."

Under Mei's influence, her husband also realised his important role in family education and developed a stronger sense of parental responsibility. Now the couple undertake joint responsibilities to look after their children: in the day-time, Mei looks after their son at home, while her husband takes their daughter to the farmland; in the evening, the couple read picture books and play puzzles with the children. Mei commented: "Being part of the project helped me a lot. The project team's work over the past years is very meaningful, and I do believe children and their families could get powerful benefits from the project, which may change their future."


EARLY CHILDHOOD DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME



BENEFICIARY STORY

Befriend the Emotions, Accompany Children's Growth

Mr. HOU has always been concerned about his daughters, a 5-year-old and a 7-year-old. The younger often expresses sadness through crying and the older one tends to have emotional outbursts, which could be challenging for Mr. and Mrs. HOU to handle and results in occasional arguments with the two kids.

To further understand his children and improve parenting skills, Mr. HOU decided to attend a four-session workshop themed on social emotional learning organised by SC China CO's Early Childhood Development Programme, which provides opportunities to practice hands-on skills that can be implemented at home. Mr. HOU was pleasantly surprised to discover that the sessions were engaging, enjoyable, and straight to the point. Impressed by the approach, he encouraged his wife to join in one of the sessions.

Mr. and Mrs. HOU then practiced parenting skills and games with their daughters at home. They conducted a family meeting to discuss family rules and created a "Bedtime To-Do List", in which the children decided what to do before bed. Mr. HOU noted positive changes afterwards, "I noticed a significant improvement in how our younger daughter responded to our instructions with reduced emotional intensity. One week after discussing the bedtime routine, she ceased procrastinating." The younger daughter shared, "I felt happy and involved. It's like mommy and daddy can now talk with me nicely." "After making the rules, I like to follow them, instead of being told what to do. My sister also calms down like me and we sleep together. That's like playing a game!"

Mr. HOU has now a better understanding of emotions and effective communication. He elaborated, "I fully understood the necessity of respecting a child's voice, exercising patience, and refraining from anger. Engaging in open dialogues and listening to my kids' thoughts have taught me to interact gently and playfully (like tickling) with them, through which they could express their feelings more freely. The session on 'Empathy' has helped me avoid temper tantrums, thus fostering my personal growth. My kids now feel more connected to me."

Mr. HOU shared: "Such learning opportunities are often limited for parents occupied with work. I've benefited a lot from the participatory sessions and would like to engage in more in the future. I'd encourage more parents to join. Let's provide wholehearted care for our children."

CHILD PROTECTION AND DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

We have supported the construction and improvement of child protection mechanisms and the integrated service platform in child-friendly spaces; provided integrated protection and development services for minors; carried out child-participation and child-led thematic activities in communities and schools; provided case services for children in need; organised family education guidance activities for parents; conducted capacity enhancement training for child workers. We have protected children and promote their development through multidimensional support to meet their physical and mental developmental needs.



We have supported the **improvement of standards for the integrated child protection and development service** in community at programme sites. The Measures on Strengthening the Care of Left-behind Children and the Protection of Minors issued by Wenshan Prefecture, Yunnan Province, includes a work plan to roll out the integrated child protection and development service model child-friendly spaces in community/village-level. This model will be extended to four communities in Bengbu, Anhui Province, and will be adapted to the local situation based on the foundation and needs of local minors' protection services.



We have improved and refined the **four-tiered child protection** mechanism at the programme site in Meishan, Sichuan Province, and supported the development of the case management service module for minors in difficulties on the Meishan City Intelligent Minors' Protection Platform.



We have supported a team of experts from Chengdu University of Technology to work with the Meishan Minors' Protection Centre to develop and refine **guidance and recommendations related to assessing the guardianship capacity of scattered orphans' families**, so as to facilitate the flow of the local child protection mechanism and the effective articulation of the work of various departments.



We organised a **programme summary meeting** in Wenshan Prefecture, Yunnan province with **110 government and CSO partners** from Meishan, Sichuan Province and Wenshan Prefecture, as well as national experts and scholars in the field of protection of minors, aiming to share and exchange experiences and achievements, providing advice for the development of the programme.





BENEFICIARY STORY



Sunny Side Up: Multi-Pronged Help to a Teenager with Epilepsy and His Family

Xiao Yan* was born as the third child of an ordinary farming family. As he grew up, his language ability lagged significantly behind his peers. Due to limited scientific literacy and lack of medical support, Xiao Yan's family neither took his illness seriously nor implemented any appropriate treatment or care. When Xiao Yan was 10 years old, his family applied for a speech disability certification and submitted a study application to Yanshan Special School for him. Nevertheless, at the age of 12, he began to show symptoms of epilepsy, such as foaming at the mouth and convulsions throughout the body. Xiao Yan could not take care of himself and defecated casually. His attending school had to be repeatedly postponed.

Xiao Yan's father raised pigs at home. He could only work outside when Xiao Yan's condition was relatively stable, leaving the task of taking care of Xiao Yan to the youngest sister Xiao Nan. However, this obviously exceeded the capabilities and responsibilities of the 13-year-old girl. Xiao Yan always made loud noises by hitting bowls and knocking on his sister's door, seriously affecting her studies.

In 2022, SC China CO Child Protection and Development Programme established a child-friendly space, and deployed local social workers and a child officer to deliver services in Xiao Yan's village. During home visits, our social workers identified the predicament faced by Xiao Yan's family and began to tailor specialized services for them.

Medical resources were linked to help Xiao Yan obtain scientific medical diagnosis and professional medical care. Professional rehabilitation resources were also introduced to Xiao Yan to promote his stability and recovery. Throughout this process, our social worker and child officer accompanied Xiao Yan and his family to communicate therapy and provided them with psychological support.

The overall support also included Xiao Yan's sister Xiao Nan*. She had more time and a quieter environment for study. In addition, our social worker helped her learn menstrual care knowledge, and enhanced her self-protection awareness and capabilities. Xiao Nan shared with our social worker: "I've learned about adolescence knowledge, how to deal with challenges and risks, which helped me

better understand myself. I no longer feel inferior because of our family situation. I hope to grow up to be someone like you to help others!"

These positive changes have lightened the atmosphere in Xiao Yan's family, and gradually raised confidence in their future life. "His condition is now relatively stable. He will use his hands to eat when he's hungry, and also can romp with me on the sofa, which is much better than before," Xiao Yan's father said, "I hope this project continues, and social workers can always provide services in our village, so that more children can benefit from the service."





BENEFICIARY STORY

Know Yourself Better and Stride toward Future



Ayi*, born in Ganluo County, Liangshan Yi Autonomous Prefecture, Sichuan Province, faced challenges in a poor, mountainous region with a large Yi population. With school and family support, she attended Sichuan Zhixiang Vocational and Technical School in Chengdu, her first time away from family. Weekends saw her working at restaurants to alleviate the family's financial strain. In school, Ayi struggled with self-expression and lacked personal opinions, leading to strained relationships with classmates.

From November to December 2023, Ayi participated in the Youth Development and Employment Programme of SC China CO and received training sessions and a group activity on improving employability skills. Initially uncertain about her future, Ayi considered quitting school to support her siblings but lacked direction. During the "self-cognition" session, with trainer Doudou's guidance, Ayi became more active, and interacted more with classmates. After the activity, she planned to build a solid foundation of study first and made up her mind to work hard.

After "self-management" and "social interaction" sessions, Ayi recognized weaknesses in attention, interpersonal skills, and learning management. She often got distracted in class, failed to complete plans, and had conflicts with friends and roommates, acknowledging her shortcomings. Ayi aimed to maintain healthier social relationships and identified the lack of clear employment goals in her self-management. Social worker ZHANG Yan noted,

"Ayi found her self-management lacking and decided to improve." Ayi appreciated the "relationship circle", acquiring communication skills for better interactions with peers, teachers, and parents. She planned to discuss her studies and the future with her parents. She even borrowed learning materials from senior students to enhance academic performance, as mentioned by Ayi's roommate.

Ayi is now more proactive, completing assignments promptly. Roommates have observed her improved mood and increased social comfort. She actively participates in class and extracurricular activities, and has joined the basketball team. Ayi stated, "I will continue working hard for further study, expanding my future employment choices and possibilities."



BENEFICIARY STORY



Positive Parenting Brings Hearts Closer Together

Xiaoru* and her parents have been struggling with their communication for a long time. Xiaoru thought her father would never change his temper, for which she didn't express herself. Xiaoru's father signed them both up for the Parenting without Violence (PwV) Parallel Group conducted by SC China CO's Family Protection Programme, including a Positive Parenting Group and a Children's Group (CG), with the hope to improve the relationship with Xiaoru.

The CG sessions covered topics like identifying and expressing emotions, gender identities, and what constitutes violence. Xiaoru enjoyed every session

but particularly benefited from learning about expressing emotions. "When I was in elementary school, I often suppressed my emotions and didn't share them with my parents. Because I was not good at expressing my emotions, and my parents were quite harsh--I worried about their bad temper."

Xiaoru and her father participated in every session and became more motivated to express themselves. "I started to understand myself and my parents better. Before taking the Children's Group sessions, I thought everything was my parents' fault. Now I realised I was a headstrong kid." Xiaoru said.

Xiaoru's father also reflected on his parenting practice. "My wife and I had bad tempers, and Xiaoru used to argue with her mother often. We thought it was because Xiaoru became rebellious. Now I understand that we didn't put ourselves in Xiaoru's shoes. She felt that her younger siblings took away most of our love from her." After realizing this, Xiaoru's father spared more effort to manage his emotions, change the way he communicates, and express affection and care towards Xiaoru instead of criticism.

At the end of the workshop, Xiaoru shared her parent's change: "I feel the most significant change in my dad over these two months is that his temper has improved." She is now more willing to communicate with her parents and share her happiness and sorrow. Additionally, Xiaoru wishes to learn to manage her emotions and understand herself better in the future.


CHILD FRIENDLY JUSTICE PROGRAMME

We have upheld research on child-friendly judicial standards and indicators, as well as on the topic of comprehensive judicial protection for minors; we have continued to upgrade and improve the model of One-Stop-Centre for Forensic Interview and Protection for Child Survivors, as well as to provide training and supervision for child justice workers; and we have carried out thematic activities at schools and in communities in order to popularise the Law of the People's Republic of China on the Protection of Minors and to raise the awareness of children of their own self-protection.

KUNMING, YUNNAN PROVINCE



We have enhanced the **One-Stop-Centre** model in Panlong and Wuhua districts in Kunming by providing child protection services, including case management services, for minor victims of sexual assault, domestic violence and other serious violence as well as for the minors affected by violence and in need of protection.

POLICY ADVOCACY

- With the support of the Supreme People's Procuratorate, we worked with the research team from the China University of Political Science and Law to conduct and complete a study on child-friendly judicial standards, producing a research report and drafting **child-friendly judicial standards and indicators** on the basis of the study.
- Two pilot One-Stop-Centres in Wuhua and Panlong District of Kunming, received a study visit of a capacity building event jointly organised by the Supreme People's Procuratorate, the Supreme People's Court and the Ministry of Public Security, in which we **shared work experience of the pilot with case handlers from 8 provinces**.
- Under the support of the programme, the **Seminar on Integrated Judicial Protection of Minors** was held in Beijing under the guidance of the Ninth Procuratorate of the Supreme People's Procuratorate, and hosted by the Centre for Procuratorial Research on Minors of Beijing Normal University, and the Research Base for the Governance and Law of Minors' Affairs of the China University of Political Science and Law. The seminar was attended by 38 experts and scholars in related fields and representatives of practical departments, providing a theoretical basis and practical experience for the comprehensive judicial protection of minors.

BENEFICIARY STORY

Seeing Hope Again



Having lost her father at an early age, Xuanxuan* lived with her jobless mother in blame and preach. She had to be suspended from school because of major depressive disorder. At the age of 14, Xuanxuan was indecently assaulted by her mother's live-in boyfriend and had intensified self-injuring actions afterwards.

Upon receiving the abuse case report, local police promptly initiated One-Stop Center (OSC) Mechanism, under which child-friendly forensic interview and assessment of her situation were conducted immediately. The assessment revealed the limited parenting capacity of her mother, the risk of re-encountering the perpetrator, Xuanxuan's strong need for social connection, etc.

With the belief that children are experts in their own lives, OSC engaged Xuanxuan in service planning and drew up a multi-disciplinary service plan to facilitate her recovery. Based on the plan, a coordinated effort involving local police, procuratorate, government agencies, social worker, and lawyer crafted individualized supporting actions such as entrusting Xuanxuan's care to her aunt, securing subsistence allowances, reinforcing parenting practices, providing case management, supporting back-to-school.

Particularly, Yipeng, a seasoned judicial social worker supported by SC China CO, embarked on a long journey with Xuanxuan with timely follow-up and focus on her well-being. "Yipeng impressed me, treated me with patience, understood and never blamed me," said Xuanxuan. Through multiple home

visits, Yipeng repaired Xuanxuan's soured family relationship, and also enabled Xuanxuan to pursue her interest in painting which helped uplift her self-worth and foster empowerment. "It is great that I can learn painting, and with encouragement I continue my interest. My techniques have been improved and my work was even displayed in the school lobby."

After experiencing her progress in painting, Xuanxuan now is motivated to take more initiative and feels that she is ready to embrace a bright future. "I am interested in cosplay and sometimes I dress up with my friends. I love especially the wig styling part and I want to learn that one day. Though I'm only in Grade 8, I have discussed my future education with my aunt so that I can prepare in advance." Xuanxuan not only moves on from the past, but also builds up courage to help another child survivor of sexual abuse to report her case and provide peer support.

Xuanxuan's case management was closed with her successful adaptation to a new living and learning environment. In the summer of 2023, Yipeng was thrilled to receive a message from Xuanxuan sharing her high-scoring composition "Seeing Hope Again", where she documented the changes in herself after receiving service at OSC. At the end of the composition, Xuanxuan wrote: "As long as you don't give up, dark clouds will clear one day. You can see hope again if you strive."



We assisted in organising the training session on quality enhancement of inclusive education in Sichuan Province to share the practical experience in the programme sites, which was attended by a total of 167 inclusive education workers.

BENEFICIARY STORY

Specialised Support for a Special Student



Binbin* is a 12-year-old boy with Attention-Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD) and mild intellectual disabilities in his 6th grade. Binbin has a perpetually running nose and always wears dirty clothes and shoes. He sweats a lot, frequently wets his pants, and rarely bathes, leaving a noticeable odour. With a short attention span of 5-8 minutes, Binbin sometimes bursts into anger and clashes with classmates. As the tallest and strongest kid in class, he can easily overturn a desk or engage in other risky behaviours. His literacy skills were only 1/10 of his peers, with significant delays in language expres-

sion and reading speed. His classmates avoided playing with him, some teachers were reluctant to go to his classroom, and a few parents of his classmates requested Binbin's transfer to another class.

The school tried different ways to support Binbin, including waiving his tuition and lunch fees. In 2022 when SC China CO's Disability and Inclusion Programme started, Binbin's school became one of the project schools in Jinjiang District. Inspired by the project's idea of building an inclusive campus, the school installed a water heater and provided clean clothes for Binbin. Teachers also guided him in personal hygiene and encouraged healthy habits.

As the project started, Ms. GAO Cuixian became a full-time resource room teacher to support students with special needs. She received teacher training and regular guidance from the district Special Education

Resource Center supported by the programme. Binbin attended individualized training sessions in the resource room, including emotion control exercises, attention training, and interaction with peers.

In class, subject teachers adapted class teaching to Binbin's needs by setting tailored tasks and engaging multiple senses. Binbin's literacy skills have improved, and he could now memorise texts, solve simple math problems, and write more neatly. As his participation in class and confidence increased, Binbin has demonstrated fewer behaviour problems. His classmates noticed his change, "Binbin hasn't gotten into fights or used foul language for a long time. We are willing to have lunch with him."

In November 2023, Binbin and his classmates participated in the Inclusive Education picture book reading supported by SC China CO and learned more about diversity and inclusion. "After the event, more children and parents started to accept Binbin!" said Ms. GAO. Through activities like this, the awareness of inclusion has gradually taken root in the school.



Green Mindset Framework Developed for Children Aged 3-6

A green mindset framework for children aged 3-6 was developed based on the scope and indicators of Early Childhood Education for Sustainability defined by international academics and early childhood education institutions, as well as Early Learning and Development Guideline for Children Aged 3-6 issued by the Ministry of Education of the People's Republic of China. By systematically explaining and introducing the conceptual knowledge, skills, actions, and methods from a sustainable development perspective involved in the cultivation of a green mindset, the framework provides teachers and trainers with detailed and practical instructions on designing and implementing curriculum or related activities of green mindset, and on facilitating children's interaction with the environment in a green manner. The framework will guide the integration of climate change and sustainable development components into pre-existing and future Early Childhood Development work of SC China CO.



Climate Change Integrated with Child Protection to Build a Better Community

Climate change-themed activities were conducted in 7 child-friendly spaces, 1 social worker station and 4 schools in Wenshan Prefecture, Yunnan Province, involving more than 140 children.

33 social workers and teachers received training organised by the community's integrated service platform, which supports them in designing and conducting child-themed activities integrated with child protection, child participation and child-led elements, developing children's awareness of environmental protection, and leading children to identify environmental problems around them and take action to participate in environmental protection and improvement.

A systematic intervention plan was provided to improve youth's green skills, including three modules: green professional quality, career guidance and career development community. Green-focused employability skills training was delivered to 4,925 adolescents.

4 green clubs were established in schools and communities, attracting 91 new adolescent members to learn environmental protection skills.

Youth-led Innovation Lab brought 106 adolescents together with experts and entrepreneurs to develop innovative social or business solutions to local problems related to climate change and the green economy, among which 2 green solutions have been adopted by enterprises for further implementation.



Board Game Developed to Raise Climate Change Awareness

A climate change-themed board game "Xiao An's Summer" was developed to support children in gaining knowledge of climate change in a fun and interactive way. Using SC China CO's FSP community-based activity package and the board game "Xiao'an's Summer" as the main tools, we conducted 20 activities for approximately 777 children across 5 schools and 3 communities in Ya'an, Sichuan Province, equipping children with a better understanding of climate change risks, and encouraging children to take eco-friendly actions with their families to create safer, more sustainable, and more environmental-friendly communities.
